

#### Description

- The transition of all HIPAA covered entities from the use of ICD-9-CM to ICD-10-CM/PCS codes on October 1, 2015 will create a paradigm change in the use of electronic health record (EHR) data
- Many public health surveillance entities that receive, interpret, analyze, and report ICD9 encoded data will be significantly impacted by the transition
- Two jurisdictions (NC and NH) will detail their transition plans and associated activities in this webinar

- DPH ICD-10 Implementation Project charter approved May 2011
  - Project Goal: Ensure that the staff and information systems that currently utilize ICD-9-CM for classification of disease and morbidity information within the Section/Branches of the Division of Public Health and local health departments seamlessly transition to the federally mandated ICD-10 effective October 1, 2015.
  - Project Sponsor: Chief, Administrative, Local & Community Support Section





- NC DHHS ICD-10 Project
  - Department level project formalized in Dec 2013
  - All offices/divisions in DHHS impacted by ICD-10 are included in the project
    - Primarily public health, mental health, rural health, DHHS IT, Medicaid
  - Project monitored by State CIO
  - NC DHHS ICD-10 Steering Committee chaired by DHHS CIO

    - Birth Defects Monitoring Program Registry
    - CareWare (AIDS data)
    - Health Information System (Patient Management/ Billing/EMR) and interfaces
    - Client Services Data Warehouse

    - NC Tracks
    - StarLims (State Laboratory for Public Health)

Family Planning



- Key activities to date
  - Regular communications to 500+ ICD-10 contacts throughout the state
  - 10 public health providers selected to participate in Medicaid provider/trading end-to-end testing during Spring/Summer 2015

## NH's Surveillance Transition Plan

Participate in national ICD-10-CM transition activities (2013-2014)






- Downloaded CMS ICD-9 & ICD-10 codes (2013)
- Developed contract to augment IT Staff (2013-2014)
  - Took advantage of NH Department of Information Technology (DoIT) Contract for Advanced Temporary Technical Services (CATTS) contracting mechanism
  - Quicker contracting process due to pre-selected vendors
- Added new ICD-9 and ICD-10 codes to syndromic system database (2013-2014)





- Augmented IT Staff (2013 2014)
- Added ICD-10 fields/tables (2013 2014)
  - Added code field to diagnosis table
  - Added reportable disease group/code tables)








- Added ICD-10 processing (2013-2014)
  - Web-maintenance of 24 or 72 hour reportable disease groups

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
- Added ICD-10 processing (2013-2014)

#### Overview of ICD-9/10 transition Business Functions

- Develop multi-functional plan to receive, process, store, and use ICD-10 codes
- Develop technical requirements and specifications based on business need
- 3. Develop ICD-9 to 10 code mappings
- 4. Revise existing syndromic definitions and queries
- 5. Revise analytical procedures
- Produce codebooks, conversion tools, reference materials and best practices to share with the Public Health community







- Participated in ISDS national ICD-10 transition efforts (2013-2014)
  - Worked with ISDS work group to map ICD-9 to 10 codes

#### Syndrome Classification Exercise

 Using NH's Influenza-Like-Illness (ILI/ARI) code syndrome, translate related ICD-9 code 487.0 to ICD-10 codes. Original ICD-9 list: 079.99,382.9,460,461.9,465.8,465.9, 466.0,486,487.0,487.1,487.8,490,780.6,786.2

 Next, reverse translate related ICD-10 codes to ICD-9 codes (type J11.00, then J12.9), suggests adding 480.9.

#### NH's Transition 2015 Plan


- Continue participation in ISDS national ICD-10 transition efforts
  - Integrate best practices
- Coordinate hospital ICD-10 code testing
  - Test with hospitals that are ready
  - Develop plan for hospitals not ready





### NH's Transition 2015 Plan

- Develop historical trending strategy
  - Impact on analysis
    - Should we trend ICD-9 to ICD-10 or vice-versa?
    - What code or specific condition should be chosen in assignment of ICD-10 codes to ICD-9 historical baselines?
    - How should we reconcile non-conforming provider data?
