

Occupational Visits Broad V1

Definition Factsheet & Technical Brief

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Definition Description:

The objective is to capture **work-related emergency department visits**, including injuries and illnesses, among youth and adults ages 14 years and older. The minimum age of employment is 14 with a few exceptions that may not be fully captured by this definition, such as agricultural jobs and working in a family business.

Use-Cases for Definition:

Case-finding: Secondary

Trend monitoring: Primary

Early outbreak detection: Not Intended as Use Case

Emergent Condition: Not Intended as Use Case

Justification:

There is not a “work-related” or “occupational” field in ESSENCE, and collection of occupation and industry data is not currently required by facilities that submit data to ESSENCE. The original occupational subsyndrome definition in ESSENCE was evaluated and determined to be too broad, capturing many non-cases.¹ A consistent, accurate, yet adaptable definition to identify work-related emergency department visits is essential for improving usefulness of ESSENCE for timely occupational health surveillance. It may also assist with disaster and outbreak responses where identifying the subset of work-related visits is important.

Data Source During Development: Emergency department visits. Chief Complaint Query Validation dataset (CCQV) in ESSENCE.

Validation Methods:

1. See Appendix for full evolution of definition development. A validation worksheet including the query syntax and questions regarding the query was created and introduced to the nine participating jurisdictions (KY, LA, MA, MI, NE, NJ, OR, WI, WA). Participants were asked to review visits between January 1, 2024 and December 31, 2024.
2. Initial review (Round 1) was completed by all nine jurisdictions.
3. After receiving feedback from these jurisdictions, a new iteration of the query was created.
4. Subsequent review (Round 2) was completed by six jurisdictions (KY, LA, MA, MI, WA, WI).

Validation Results: Jurisdictions calculated positive predictive value (PPV) by comparing visits that were deemed a true positive (i.e., a visit of interest) to all visits identified by the definition in a defined period. True positive criteria was based on Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) standards for recording and reporting occupational injuries and illnesses.² A visit was considered a true positive if it was an initial visit for an injury or illness that occurred while at work, OR an injury or illness that was exacerbated by work activities. At work or work activities means the individual was 1) working for income or pay, or 2) in a volunteer role, or 3) while in a training role (e.g. medical/nursing student, resident, apprentice, military training), or 4) doing agricultural production activities. Occurring at work was determined by clear language in the chief complaint to indicate this, or if worker's compensation (or a variant of worker's compensation) was present, or if the discharge diagnosis code was Y99.0 (civilian activity done for income or pay) or Y99.1 (military activity).

Round 1 of validation testing resulted in a PPV range of 44% to 99% across testing jurisdictions. Round 2 of testing on the updated definition resulted in a PPV range of 77% to 96% reflecting more consistent performance after modifications.

Limitations: This definition may capture some false positives, such as visits describing becoming ill at work due to non-work related concerns or existing conditions (particularly for conditions and symptoms such as seizures, chest pain, syncope/fainting). It is not always possible to determine whether these visits are truly work-related or not work-related based on the information reported to ESSENCE. It may also capture chronic injuries (regardless of work-relatedness), injuries sustained during recreational/hobby/home-based activities that are difficult to determine whether related to work done for pay, or repeat/follow-up visits for the same injury. There may be chief complaint terms and discharge diagnoses codes that are usually work-related in some jurisdictions, but not others (e.g. due to presence of certain industries/occupations, such as agricultural activities). Jurisdictions may need to make modifications tailored to their specific contexts as needed; this definition attempted to include work-related terms that would capture the most visits across settings. Additionally, WC is often used as an abbreviation for "worker's compensation", but there are instances when it instead refers to words such as "wheelchair". The definition does attempt to exclude the most common chief complaint terms associated with these cases but may not exclude all instances.

Plain Language Description: The definition uses free-text chief complaint terms and discharge diagnosis codes. The definition requires that an emergency department visit contains a reference to work-relatedness (including, but not limited to, reference to worker's compensation), OR a discharge diagnosis code (ICD-10-M or SNOMED CT code) that is usually associated with a work-related illness or injury. To ensure that only initial work-related visits are captured, we excluded records with chief complaint text or discharge diagnosis codes indicating follow-up visits for the same injury or illness.

Definition Fields and Structure:

The Chief Complaint Discharge Diagnosis (CCDD) parsed field and Chief Complaint Updates are used to query both the discharge diagnosis codes and chief complaint free text, and exclusions are incorporated as necessary.

- Inclusion based on work-relatedness in chief complaint free text terms. The visit is included if it contains:
 1. A chief complaint term related to work/work-relatedness—(examples: “at work”, “work injury”, “job injury”, “work rela”, “is employee”, “while working”, “coworker”, “OTJ”, “OJI”, “employee exposure”)
 - a. Nested exclusions include: “not work rela”/”not OTJ”/”not occupational exposure”; “labwork related/bloodwork related/paperwork related”; “while working out” **OR**
 2. A chief complaint term related to worker’s compensation—(“workers comp”, “work comp”, “workm[ae]ns co”, “wcomp”, “wc”)
 - a. Nested exclusions include: “not worker comp”, and wheelchair-related terms: “declined wc”, “bib wc”, “his wc”, “to wc”, “arrives wc”; and other non-work-related terms that use wc as abbreviation: “well child”, “wound check” **OR**
- Inclusion based on ICD-10-CM discharge diagnosis codes that may be work-related (initial encounters where specified). The visit is included if it contains any of the following:
 1. Codes for work-related external causes of morbidity (examples below—see Detailed Definition Components table for full list):
 - a. V69.4[09]XA: Driver of heavy transport vehicle injured in collision, initial encounter **OR**
 - b. W12.XXXA: Fall on and from scaffolding, initial encounter **OR**
 - c. W30.[012389]XXA Exposure to industrial wiring, appliances and electrical machinery, initial encounter **OR**
 - d. W30.[012389]XXA: Contact with agricultural machinery, initial encounter **OR**
 - e. Y35.91XA: Legal intervention, means unspecified, law enforcement official injured, initial encounter **OR**

- All of the above must exclude:
 - Terms indicating a non-initial visit for the complaint—(“recheck”, “re eval”, “revisit”, follow up”, etc.) **OR**

 - Terms related to commute to/from work—(“way to work”, “traveling to work”, “late for work”, etc.)

Appendix

Definition Evolution During Development

1. A revised work-related definition was developed from the original, previously unevaluated occupational subsyndrome definition in ESSENCE which uses weighted inclusion and exclusion keywords. Records identified by the original work-related definition were evaluated against ICD-10-CM work-status codes (Y99.0/Y99.1). Additional candidate inclusion and keywords were then examined, and the revised definition was evaluated.

2. Addition of discharge diagnosis codes: a team including CDC and state-based ESSENCE users (including occupational SMEs) developed a list of potentially work-related discharge diagnosis codes (ICD-10-CM and SNOMED codes). They then performed manual reviews of records to determine which codes to retain in the revised work-related definition.
 - a. This list was informed by: Bush AM, Bunn TL, Liford M. Identification of work-related injury emergency department visits using International Classification of Diseases, Tenth Revision, Clinical Modification (ICD-10-CM) codes. *Inj Prev.* 2021;27(S1):i3-i8. doi:10.1136/injuryprev-2019-043507.
3. Two work-related definitions were developed: a broad definition (current definition) to capture all work-related visits, and a narrow one focused on injuries only. Additional inclusion and exclusion terms were added to the respective definitions in an iterative process.
4. The definitions were then tested by the nine participating jurisdictions (KY, LA, MA, MI, NE, NJ, OR, WI, WA), and CDC at the national level. (See Validation Methods above)
5. Feedback from the testers informed changes to refine inclusion/exclusion chief complaint terms and discharge diagnosis codes.
 - a. Major changes included:
 - b. Removed ICD10 code Y93H[39] which were often undetermined visits and reported problematic by multiple states
 - c. Added “chronic”, “history of” as exclusion terms for work injury terms to attempt to exclude old/chronic (>1 yr old) injuries
 - d. Added “not” versions of inclusions terms, such as “not work rela”, “not workers comp”, etc.
 - e. Additional exclusion terms for WC (which is a common abbreviation for worker’s compensation) such as well child, wound check, and additional wheelchair-related terms
 - f. Additional exclusions for home-based/hobbies/recreational, non-work activities (e.g. working on his/her car, working in the yard, etc.).
 - g. Exclusions for social work, labwork, bloodwork, paperwork as the mention of “work” in the chief complaint
6. Updated definitions were tested by a subset of the original nine jurisdictions to obtain a final PPV.
